To fold up the headrest

- (a) place your hands symmetrically in the centre of the headrest,
- (b) then pull the headrest towards you as far as it will go (upright position),
- (c) when the upright position is achieved, the locking mechanism will be released,
- (d) when the lock of the mechanism is released, the headrest may be comfortably adjusted to the starting position.



FINAL REMARKS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- When moving furniture, always lift it - do not pull it e.g. by the upholstery or by the cushions, as this may damage it. The floor and the legs of the furniture may also be damaged.
- You may not sit on backrests, footrests, armrests, shoulder tops, handrails or headrests. High loads may damage the furniture structure or cause permanent deformation.
- Upholstery made of leather or fabric should not be subjected to strong pressure points, e.g. when leaning on the knee, as this may cause the leather to split or tear or the seams to split.
- Furniture must not be placed in areas of intense sunlight or near heat sources. Both factors may adversely affect leather, fabric or wood and cause permanent discolouration.
- Furniture and all its parts - whether made of leather, wood, metal or glass - should be protected from prolonged exposure to liquids and fluids. Liquids and fluids may cause permanent damage to surfaces and even the structure of materials.
- Do not place anything hot (e.g. hot dishes) on wooden or varnished surfaces, as this can permanently damage the varnish.

HOW TO DEAL WITH NEW FURNITURE AFTER DELIVERY

• Sharp tools must not be used when unpacking furniture. Proper unpacking prevents irreversible damage to upholstery and exposed surfaces.

• Immediately after unpacking, irregular folds or creases may appear on furniture covered with natural leather. This is the result of transporting packaged furniture. Unpack, assemble the furniture and let it rest for a few hours at room temperature, then it will regain its shape. This process should be assisted by modelling the cushions by hand.

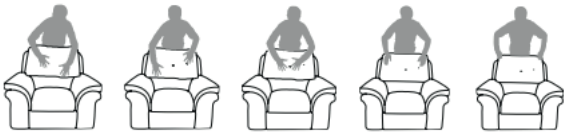


Fig. cushion modelling

• If the furniture has been transported in sub-zero ambient temperatures, it should be left at room temperature for at least 2 hours after unpacking. The furniture must not be used and cushions must not be modelled during this time. Failure to do so may result in cracks in the top layer of leather.

• Immediately after unpacking, new furniture releases its own characteristic smell, which is the natural smell of materials and raw materials. It is particularly intense after unpacking, but weakens spontaneously after some time and eventually fades away.

• An important part of preparing the furniture for use is securing the feet with felt pads to protect the floor from possible damage. The manufacturer is not liable for any damage to the floors resulting from missing felt pads or improper condition of the felt pads.

• The shape of the felt pads is best adjusted by cutting them to the shape of the foot. Please note: putting the pads on the furniture feet does not mean that moving the furniture will not damage the floor. If you want to change the position of a piece of furniture, it always has to be lifted, moved and put in its new place.

• Selected models of furniture are equipped with legs enabling their levelling. Detailed information on how to adjust the legs is contained in a separate assembly instruction included with the furniture. Every time the furniture is moved, the feet need to be readjusted.

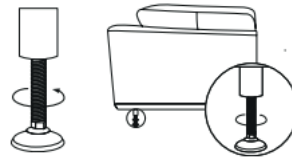


Fig. feet adjusting

RULES FOR USE

• When using furniture with soft fillings, it is necessary to model the cushions of the backrests, seats and armrests at least every two weeks. Modelling will evenly distribute the filling of the cushions, improve the comfort and appearance of the furniture and minimise permanent deformations during use.

• Using furniture covered with leather causes natural changes. Over time, the leather covering will develop folds and shine, depending on the manner and intensity of use, which are the result of subjecting the leather to friction and pressure. However, high-quality furniture leather will retain its natural elasticity (analogous to, for example, the leather of gloves, shoes or car seats).

• Daily (regular) use of furniture changes its softness and resilience. Equally intensive use of all seats in the furniture set will make the changes in the cushion softness spread evenly everywhere.

• As the furniture is used, its felt pads wear out or peel off. They should be replaced regularly according to the degree of wear.

• Any mechanisms that are part of the furniture should be used for their intended purpose. Depending on the intensity of use, it is recommended to regularly (every 2 months) maintain the joints of the metal mechanisms (e.g. bed mechanism, relaxer mechanism, mobile base) with maintenance and lubrication agents such as e.g. technical petroleum jelly, Teflon spray lubricant. After preservation, any excess lubricant should be removed to protect other parts of the furniture from possible contamination.

LEATHER COVERS

At KLER we use only natural grain leather of the highest quality. Leather is a natural raw material, each piece is different. Therefore, differences in colour and texture of leather covers are unavoidable, both within a single piece of furniture and between pieces of the same furniture set. These differences may be more apparent when purchasing furniture from different supplies.

Leather is distinguished by its natural characteristics - small scratches, veins, wrinkles, punctures, scars and other marks from before the tanning process that make leather unique. These features do not have any impact on the durability.

Leather as a natural material "breathes", absorbs and gives off moisture, changes its temperature adapting to the environment.

Wrinkles, folds, slight creases, and features that develop over time are not a defect of the leather, but a sign of its naturalness.

HOW TO CARE FOR LEATHER

Leather furniture should be used in rooms with 40-70% humidity, at a temperature of 10-40°C. Regular airing of rooms helps to maintain adequate humidity.

Leather items are adversely affected by proximity to heat sources. Therefore, the furniture should be placed not less than 1 m from the nearest heat source (radiator or fireplace). Leather is also adversely affected by:

• Excessive sun exposure - putting a piece of furniture in a place with a lot of sun exposure may change the shade of the leather colour,

• moisture - cleaning the leather with a sponge/cloth that is too wet exposes it to discolouration,

• substances such as alcohol or household cleaning products, e.g. washing-up liquid, window cleaner, which can easily destroy the thin, invisible protective layer of the leather,

• cleaning the leather e.g. with a cloth previously used for window cleaning may cause damage to the upholstery,

• contact of the upholstery leather with easily discoloured clothing, e.g. denim (certain fabrics can irreversibly change the colour of any upholstery leather, especially light ones).

CLEANING AND CARE

Leather is a very durable material. Regular cleaning and maintenance will maintain its protective layer. We recommend the use of specialised cosmetics for maintenance. They should be used as intended and in accordance with the accompanying instructions, at the following intervals:

• in case of intensive use of furniture, in rooms with dry air or higher temperatures - every 3 months,

• with occasional/sporadic use of furniture - every 6 months.

It is also important to remember that before any maintenance, the leather must be cleaned.

PARTS OF FURNITURE MADE OF METAL

• Commercially available products should be used to maintain powder-coated steel components.

• For the maintenance of stainless steel components, we recommend the use of special agents that leave a thin protective film on the metal surface.
